

KUALA LUMPUR COVID-19 UPDATES as at 5 May 2021

The 2020 Malaysian Government's Movement Control Orders (MCO) is a cordon sanitaire implemented as a preventive measure by the federal government in response to the COVID-19 pandemic in the country on 18 March 2020.

Categories of MCO	Details	
Movement Control Order (MCO)	Full lockdown with restrictive SOPs and limited essential sectors allowed to operate	
Conditional Movement Control Order (CMCO)	Partial lockdown where more economic sectors were allowed to open	
Recovery Movement Control Order (RMCO)	Most of the sectors of the economy were allowed to be opened including business events subject to strict compliance to government standard operating procedures (SOPs), and interstate travel were allowed	
Enhanced Movement Control Order	Full lockdown applied at Government discretion without any in/out movement for entire districts or areas where cluster or concentrated high number of cases occur	
Targeted Enhanced Movement Control Order (TEMCO)	It a subtype of EMCO applied at Government discretion in specific buildings i where a cluster or concentrated high number of cases occurs	

Timeline of implementation of stages of MCO in Kuala Lumpur

Timeline	Stages
18 March to 30 April 2020	МСО
1 May to 9 June 2020	СМСО
10 June to 13 October 2020	RMCO
14 October 2020 to 12 January 2021	СМСО
13 January to 4 March 2021	МСО
5 March to 6 May 2021	СМСО
7 May to 20 May 2021	МСО



COVID-19 National Immunisation Programme

Timeline Targets	Phases of immunisation
February to April 2021	Phase 1 for frontliners and medical personnel's
April to August 2021	Phase 2 for high risk groups (disabled, age group 60 & above, susceptible to COVID-19 medical conditions)
May 2021 to February 2022	Phase 3 for age group 18 and above
